

Grant Highlights!

KRC has received a \$50,000 grant from the Edward K. Martin Family Endowment Fund at the Central Valley Community Foundation. Along with funding overtime warden patrols and supporting the incubator house, our conservation committee has been hard at work on new projects along the river. We are excited to highlight just a few in this issue with more on the way!

We are working to re-establish the trail from the County access point that is next to Choinumni (now, officially Sycamore Point) to the KRCD All-Access Fishing Area. A rough trail will be cleared and invasive wild fig and any dead and dangerous trees or limbs will be removed. Debris and trimmings will be stacked uphill in order to provide habitat for wildlife. We are excited to work with Reedley College who will work with the fire crews to use this as a learning experience for students learning how to work with chainsaws and how to scrape hand lines (trail building).

Check dams and water boards will be installed along the two main offshoots of the re-established trail to mitigate erosion. We will also be working with Reedley College students to get the job done.

We are broadening the existing trail from Cobble Weir to Avocado Lake. This would include ensuring that the trail is cleared for approximately 1.5 miles. We plan to also install signage along the route.

It's official! The area commonly known as "Frustration Lake" has been renamed to Sycamore Access Point.

While "frustration" may be what some have experienced fishing this calm stretch of the Kings, the Sycamore trees that grace this beautiful spot suggest a more apt name. The County access area is located just to the east of the end of the Choinumni Park on Pine Flat Road. A trail heads upriver from the parking area and features two groups of Native pounding holes.

Meet our New Development Director!







Yellowstone Tickets Still on Sale!

It's not too late to support the Frank Jones Memorial Warden Patrol Fund! Our next drawing will be held on April 23, 2022 for fishing in Yellowstone. Tickets will be on sale at the Spring Fling on April 9, 2022.

Enjoy Yellowstone National Park and fishing for two people with two days on the water. This trip is scheduled for August 22-24, 2022 (with August 23-24 on the water). Included is three nights stay at a house in West Yellowstone (one room provided). Meals and transportation are not included. Total value is \$1,150, including guided service on the water.

100% of the proceeds are forwarded to the California Department of Fish and Wildlife to fund extra warden patrols on the Kings River to help reduce the trout poaching. The program has raised more than \$115,000.
